Our Industry

By 2028, there will be an estimated 3 million job openings in the skilled trades.

Students

Based on data produced by The Heckinger Report, 59% of high school students still believe that a bachelor's degree is necessary to get a good job. Aside from a lack of awareness about the many benefits of careers in construction, the skilled trades have historically faced the challenge of a negative perception problem. It's time to address this.

Parents/Influencers

Historically, parents and guidance counselors have been key drivers of the "college is a must" mindset. Students and their families are beginning to question the value of a four-year degree and the debt that comes with it, so now is the time to drive awareness and focus on changing perceptions.

York County Businesses

The lack of skilled workers negatively impacts businesses locally, resulting in higher labor costs that are ultimately passed down to the consumers. A smaller hiring pool also makes it difficult for construction companies to meet the increased demand for services. As a result, homeowners and corporations experience delays. Left unresolved, the shortage of skilled tradespeople not only impacts hiring for local businesses, it also has the potential to limit the growth of the building and remodeling industires and the building products sectors overall.

How can we ensure that York County businesses have access to a skilled workforce? We believe that organizations like ours need to take ownership of the education, awareness, and training pipeline for the local trades. Connections

One key area of focus will be on collaborating with employers, schools and those offering skilled trade workforce training. Through our work and programs like Construction Career Days, we will be a conduit for making connections between the educators and students and those with jobs and opportunities to offer.

Opportunities

Promoting opportunities for young people considering a career in the skilled trades with be a primary focus of the Foundation. Opportunities will include Workforce NOW and other scholarships, jobs, on-the-job training, mentorships, apprenticeships, internships, etc.
